

Guidance for completing the 16-19 Bursary Funding Application

The 16-19 Bursary is awarded to eligible students to assist them in covering expenses incurred in order to attend Durham Sixth Form Centre; such as travel costs or to buy resources needed in their courses. The payment of the Bursary award is subject to DfES guidance and Durham Sixth Form Centre's Bursary Policy. These can be accessed here:-

The guidance below will help you complete the application form and identify which Bursary you may be eligible to apply for.

Bursary payments are only made if students' attendance and behaviour meet the required standard and they remain at Durham Sixth Form Centre. If your attendance falls below 90% your payment may be reduced.

1. Student Details

Eligibility Criteria for all Bursaries

Students must be aged 16 or over, but under 19 as at 31st August 2023

Students aged 19 or over are only eligible to receive a discretionary bursary if they are continuing on a study programme they began aged 16 to 18 or have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP)

Students aged 16 or under are only eligible to receive a discretionary bursary in exceptional circumstances; where a student is following an accelerated study programme

Students must be an ordinary UK Resident or have a legal right to be resident in the UK

2. Bursary Type

There are two types of 16-19 Bursaries:

A Vulnerable Pupil Bursary

Students who meet the criteria, and who have a financial need, can apply for a Bursary for Vulnerable groups. The defined groups reflect that these students are likely to require additional support to participate in Education. The award should not be automatically awarded in total, but based on an assessment of the types of costs they have.

The maximum Bursary Award is £1200 per Academic Year

Students who qualify for the Vulnerable Pupil Bursary cannot claim the Top-up Bursary

Below is a list of the eligibility criteria for the Vulnerable Pupil Bursary and the evidence required in order to make a successful claim.

	Year 12 Students: Students entitled to receive Free School Meals their previous school should still qualify this year. This data will be sent directly to Durham Sixth Form Centre from their previous school.							
	Year 13 Students		ts: Students entitled to Free School Meals last year will still be entitled to them this year.					
	Year 14 Students: Students entitled to receive Free School Meals, continuing from Year 13 will still be entitled to FSM this year. Students entitled to Free School Meals in their previous school should still qualify for them this year, their previous school will send us this data.							
Students who already receive Free School Meals do not need to provide any further evidence.
